HOW TO ACHIEVE DISCIPLINE WITH DIGNITY IN THE CLASSROOM

(based on "Discipline with Dignity" programme created by Drs Allen Mendler & Richard Curwin)

The seminar will be an interactive one so bring your urgent questions! Throughout the session, there will be a "give and take" format instead of a Q & A session at end.

Specific issues pertaining to school discipline will be addressed in greater detail. Examples are bullying, refusal to do homework, late-coming, truancy and wilful disobedience/open defiance.

Programme

Dr Mendler will begin with an overview of the Teachers' programme for administrators. Administrators will then be helped to focus on the "big picture" of discipline through reflecting on the school's discipline plan, the development and implementation of flexible policies, the use of office referrals, and on the kind of model behaviour required from staff. Throughout, reference will be made to the Discipline with Dignity model, specifically the six keys for motivating and guiding students.

Specific ways to provide support teachers and students will also be presented. These include effective ways to work with parents, ways to use alternative non-punitive strategies and using mediation and other problem-solving strategies to resolve conflict.
